<p>Do Now</p>	<p>How did Enlightenment Ideals and Theories lead to the American colonist’s decision to declare their independence from Great Britain and go to War?</p>
<p>Teaching Sequence and Suggestions</p>	<p>17.4.1 – Explain learning targets and the goal of the lesson. 17.4.2 – Students will watch a video on the how the Enlightenment influenced the American Revolution. 17.4.3 – Student will follow the path of the video taking Video Notes. 17.4.4 – Instructor will clear up some of the events and declarations contained in the video so students can gain a clearer understanding of the Revolutionary War. 17.4.5 – Students will read a selected passage on the characteristics of the American Revolution. 17.4.6 – Students will complete guided reading questions on the assigned reading.</p>
<p>Text Set Selection</p>	<p>1. Students will view a PBS Video on The Revolutionary War: Freedom and Independence. 2. Students will read Glencoe’s <i>The American Revolution</i>.</p>

Background Concerns	Instructor is concerned those students remain on task and that they do not sleep during any segments of the video. Students can be distracted talking about the American Revolution. They will naturally want to talk about some of the battles.
Text Talk	Instructor and students will engage in a brief discussion over events highlighted in the PBS Video and preface the significance of the reading.
Text Response	This will be an instructor led discussion session on causes of the Enlightenment and how they influenced the American Revolution. Students will discuss how our Founding Father's adopted many of the ideas of Rousseau, Locke, Locke, de Montesquieu, etc.
Exit Ticket	Students will respond to the prompt, "Would the American Revolution have occurred without the influence of the Enlightenment?"
