<p>Learning Targets and <i>Intentions of the Lesson</i></p>	<p>1. KNOW the characteristics, the propaganda, and key events of Europe at War. 2. UNDERSTAND and describe the events that forced the United States to declare War on Germany. 3. Read and analyze (SKILL) the Zimmerman Note and the Sinking of the Lusitania, respond to questions, and complete an America at War guided reading assignment.</p>
<p>Scope and Sequence of the Lesson</p>	<p>23.3.1 – Explain the learning targets and aim of the lesson. 23.3.2 –Students will follow direct instruction taking Cornell style/guided notes to record the information on World War I in Europe and America’s ultimate involvement in War 23.3.3 – Instructor will begin a class discussion on the causes of the World War, beginning with the Industrial Revolution. Solicit volunteers to make the connection from Industrialization to the Great War. 23.3.3 –Students will use the information gathered to build their content knowledge of World War I and then they will complete a primary document graphic organizer on the Zimmerman Note and The Sinking of the Lusitania. 23.3.4 – Students will read The American Vision’s Chapter 19, Roosevelt and the New Deal, pages 289-294</p>
<p>Text Set Selection</p>	<p>The ongoing assessment with the students is that they strengthen their primary document analysis skills. This skill requires that they think outside the box critically to come up with the best possible solution to the question.</p>
<p>Background Concerns</p>	<p>Instructor will lead a class discussion: Did America’s entrance into the war tilt the outcome in favor of the allies or was the defeat of the Central powers inevitable even if the Americans had not entered the conflict.</p>
